Conservation Easements

Peter Beblowski, chair of Antrim Conservation Commission, was in attendance to share information about Antrim's conservation easement on town land for which they were able to get several grants: Acres for America, LCHIP, NH Mooseplate and Field Pond Foundation. Antrim hired Dennis McKinney, NE Forestry Foundation based in Bennington to do the survey. They did not do a forest management plan. He noted that the Nature Conservancy has maps showing value for carbon sequestration.

To do--Beth will write to trustee of Bonsal property (Map 7, Lot 8 -125 acres and Map 3, Lot 46 – 46 acres) about our interest.

Town Forest

ConsCom plans to attend Nov. 4 selectboard meeting to explain the need for an easement on the town forest. Decided to hold Moosewood presentation in the spring. ConsCom also decided to go with Monadnock Conservancy because they have the most time invested in the project so far.

Trail Work

Anne F. reported that Sandy mowed logging road but not across the field. Had hoped to have part of field mowed as white pine is growing in, among other species. Ken Chicoine cut a few trees that were down on Sullivan Loop, most notably a large tree

down in the stream and across bridge. Ken was able to cut the limbs off bridge—to cut the tree that's in the water would require boots, etc. Big Tree trail and Milt Street are still in need of cutting. Re-blazing needed on Big Tree, Sullivan and Meadow Brook.

Bass Park

County forester, Mike Gagnon, informed Anne F. that the red pine trees in Bass park have red pine scale and should be removed as they will become a safety hazard in the next year. She will let Bass Park trustees know.
